

Coal 'scam', 2G figures humbug: Cong

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE MUMBAI, AUGUST 22 CONGRESS national spokesperson Sanjay Jha said on Thursday his party needed to be more communicative with the masses. Speaking at a session at Indian Merchants' Chamber here, Jha also claimed that the loss, which was reported in the 2G spectrum and coal block allocation scams, was "humbug" and that the figures projected by media were incorrect. "...The scam as it is made out to be is totally humbug. The figure of Rs.1.86 lakh crore is absolutely wrong. Most of the media did not understand the issue and blew up an incorrect figure," he said. Jha also took a dig at the CAG saying its reports (on both scams) were questioned by the Supreme Court."

THE police probe into the murder of anti-superstition activist Narendra Dabholkar (68) has found that the two suspects who shot him down had arrived at the spot about an hour before they killed him. The police said four persons have claimed to have seen a person similar to the one in the sketch at places where Dabholkar had visited. The activist was shot at by one of the two persons who had come to the Omkareshwar Bridge at around 7.15 am on Tuesday. Dabholkar was on a morning walk when the assailants approached him from behind and fired from a very short distance, the police said. No clear picture of the suspects could be collected from the CCTV camera footage. Investigating officer and ACP (Crime Branch) Rajendra Bhamre said based on the CCTV camera footage it is clear that the assailants came on a bike at around 6:15 pm. "They parked the bike near one end of the bridge and walked towards him. They walked passed him and shot at him from the right side, sometime between 7.12

FOR CLUES, COPS LOOKING INTO DABHOLKAR'S COMPLAINTS

ACP (CRIME BRANCH) RAJENDRA BHAMRE said the police were looking into all the cases and complaints filed by Dabholkar at various places in Maharashtra. "Our teams are looking into these complaints. There is a possibility that he was targeted by the organisation or people against whom he had initiated legal action or a complaint," he said. Meanwhile, police teams continued questioning members of various organisations active in Maharashtra, including some Hindu organisations. Some members of these organisations were summoned to the Pune police crime branch on Thursday for inquiry. KEY FINDINGS SO FAR ■ Police have found a diary belonging to Dabholkar at his house. "It is not a daily journal but a notebook. We are checking its contents for possible clue," an officer said. ■ Till now at least 50 people have shared information with the police. Vacate flats in 3 months, SC tells 6 families

SIX families residing on the top two floors of a building in the Campa Cola compound, Worli, will have to vacate their homes within three months. The families, residing in Shubh Apartments, had filed a special leave petition (SLP) and urged the Supreme Court to consider their case separately from that of the six other buildings

in the compound. However, the SC dismissed the SLP and granted the residents time till October to vacate their flats. Unauthorised floors of all seven buildings are set to be demolished by October as per a Supreme Court order. The SC order, issued in May, permitted BMC to demolish all structures above the fifth floor of the seven buildings in the compound. Shubh Apartments is a ground-plus-seven structure. The sixth and seventh floors house six families. Illegal floors of Midtown Apartments, Esha Ekta

granted permission for ground-plus-five floors, Midtown has 20 floors, Orchid 17, Esha Ekta eight, Shubh seven and B Y and Patel six floors each. "The apex court has granted the residents of the sixth and seventh floors of Shubh Apartments time till November 30 to vacate their flats provided they submit an affidavit in this regard," said senior lawyer Pallav Shishodia, who appeared for BMC along with BMC lawyer JJ Xavier. "The sixth and seventh floors of the building will be demolished in October 30 as per the SC order," said a senior civic official. The BMC has issued tenders to demolish the unauthorised portions of the buildings. Following a Supreme Court verdict in February, BMC had issued a 48-hour demolition notice to residents of the 35 unauthorised floors. However, residents approached the Supreme Court asking for regularisation of their unauthorised floors under permissible FSI. The SC had later quashed their request and granted them time till October to vacate.

On release eve, Madras Cafe faces mob fury

THE giant-sized banner of Madras Cafe at Cinemax Sion that overlooks a crucial juncture of the area adjacent to the Sion circle disappeared in seconds as a mob set it on fire protesting its release on Friday. The protest seeking ban on the screening of Madras Cafe was organised by a number of groups in support of the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) in and around Sion and Matunga. "Our leader Seeman, along with several others, saw the film in a screening in Chennai. It was unanimously considered to be an anti-Tamil film that shows the LTTE, who fought for the LTTE in Sri Lanka, as terrorists," said Antony Tamilan, a member of Naam Tamilar Party, a group that was formed in 2009 following the killing of LTTE chief Velupillai Prabhakaran. Despite the protests, the film is set to release on Fri-

day across India. Even the Tamil Nadu government gave the release of the movie dubbed in Tamil its go-ahead on Thursday evening. Nambi Rajan, owner of Aurora cinema in Mumbai, said that unless there was a legal ban, the theatre would screen the film. Although several organisations took part in the protests, the Viduthala Chiruthaigal Katchi (VCK) and the South Indian cell of

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Mumbai, led the demonstrations. Hordes of protesters entered the scene armed with flags and hoardings. They went to the extent of calling the film an agenda-driven conspiracy by the Congress and Sri Lankan government. "The Congress is trying to play the Rajiv Gandhi assassination card before the 2014 elections. Thousands of Tamils were slaughtered,

2,500 women were raped in Sri Lanka. The film doesn't show that side. It shows Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa in a good light and the LTTE members as terrorists," said Raja Udsaiya, secretary of the South Indian cell of BJP. M Karun, founder-president of Indian Penpals League, added, "That the Censor Boards have also cleared it proves that the Indian government is backing the film to serve their political interests." The VCK plans to stage a dharna in front of producer-actor John Abraham's Bandra house on Friday morning. "We won't move from there till Abraham stops the movie's release," added G Arjun, a member of VCK. The outfit had earlier organised a similar protest in front of Amitabh Bachchan's house in 2010 when Tamil community had condemned Sri Lanka as a venue for a film awards of which he was a brand ambassador.

State to roll out Rs 1,060-crore emergency medical service on Oct 1

COME October and Maharashtra would be first state in the country where doctors would be on board ambulances that will have advanced life support systems. As part of the Rs 1,060-crore Emergency Medical Services (EMS), the response centre is getting ready at the district hospital in Aundh, Pune. The prototype of the ambulances are being tested at the city-based Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) and the results will be out in September. "The production will start after that," said Dr Satish Pawar, Director of Health. Pawar said 90 per cent of the work at the district hospital has been completed. State Health Minister Suresh Shetty told Newsline that 937

In a first, doctors to be present in hi-tech ambulances; response centre getting ready in Aundh

hi-tech ambulances based on the golden hour project would be operational via the toll free number 108. Once a call is received through this number, the location and area from where the call has originated flashes on the computer screen. The ambulance drivers are then alerted. The call can come from any part of the state and will be coordinated from the Aundh district hospital. Nearly 1,000 hospitals have been identified where emergency services will be provided under the project. Project CEO Dr Dnyaneshwar Shelke said for this service medics are being trained in Pune and Mumbai. So far 300 doctors have been trained and senior-level manpower is being

recruited for the project. "Work is under way to collect data on the type of emergency each hospital can handle," Shelke said. The project aims to ensure that the ambulance reaches the patient within 20 minutes of distress call in urban areas and within 30 minutes in rural areas. While 22 Advance Life Support Ambulances (ALS) and 62 Basic Life Support Ambulances (BLS) have been assured for Pune and 142 for Mumbai, across the state there will be 233 ALS and 704 BLS. Though officials have been assured that the toll free number would be 108, Shelke said 16 municipal corporations use the same number as part of the disaster manage-

ment project. "However, the proposal has been set to the Department of Telecommunication," he said. The medical emergencies that will be covered under the project include road accidents, natural calamities, epidemic outbreak, serious illnesses and allied problems besides emergencies related to pregnant women and newborns. It also envisages an integrated approach to provide emergency response services that includes computer technology integration, voice logger system, GIS (Geographic Information System), GPS (Geographic Position System) AVL (Automatic Vehicle Location System) & Mobile Communication System (MCS).
